Timbó Vest

by Gabriella Calderini

The Timbó Vest is a simple yet interesting knit, suitable for beginners and fast enough to become your go-to gift project. It is worked from top down in an easy broken rib stitch, with a stockinette shoulder detail.

Sizes

XS (S) M (L) XL (2XL) 3XL (4XL)

Finished Measurements (sample)

Length (from high point shoulder) 19' (19.5') 20.5' (21.5') 22.5' (23.5') 24.5' (25.5') / 48cm (50cm) 52cm (55cm) 57cm (59cm) 61cm (63cm)

Back width – 13.5' (14.5') 16' (18') 19' (20') 21' (22.5') / 34cm (37cm) 41cm (45cm) 48cm (51cm) 54cm (57cm)

Armhole depth – 9' (9') 9.5' (9.5') 10' (10') 10' (10.5') / 23cm (23cm) 24cm (24cm) 25cm (26cm) 26cm (27cm)

Bust width (circum.) – 30' (33') 36' (39.5') 43.5' (47') 51' (55') / 76cm (84cm) 92cm (100cm) 110cm (120cm) 130cm (140m)



Yarn

Manos del Uruguay Cardo

100% Corriedale Wool, 100 mts / 109 yds per 100 grs skein

Color A - 3 (3) 3 (3) 4 (5) 5 (5) hanks

Color B – 2 (2) 3 (3) 4 (4) 5 (5) hanks

Shown in Goldenrod (A) and Pumpkin (B)



Needles and Tools

Circular needles – 10 ½ (6.5mm) / 16', 24', 40' (40cm, 60cm, 100cm)

Stitch markers

Tapestry needle.



Gauge

15 sts x 22 rows = 4'x4' (10cmx10cm) in Broken Rib Pattern.

Broken Rib Pattern

In the round

1st Round – (k1, p1) repeat.

2nd Round – knit all the row.

In Back and Forth

1st Row (RS) – (k1, p1) repeat.

2nd Row (WS) – purl all the row.

Directions

Collar

With Color A, CO 68(68)70(70)74(74)78(82) sts on 10.5(6 ½ mm), using Long Tail method.

Join to knit in the round, making sure that the CO edge is not twisted.

Place a stm. to indicate the beginning of the round and the Center Back (CB).

1st Round – (k1, p1) 6 (6) 6 (6) 7 (7) 7 (8) times, k 10 (10) 11 (11) 11 (10) 12 (11), (k1, p1) 12 (12) 12 (12) 13 (13) 14 (14) times, k 10 (10) 11 (11) 11, (10) 12 (11), (k1, p1) 6 (6) 6 (6) 7 (7) 7 (8) times.

2nd Round – Knit to marker.

Repeat 1st and 2nd Row 5 (5) 5 (5) 6 (6) 6 (6) more times.

Shoulder and Yoke increases

Now you start knitting increases, to shape the shoulders and yoke.

Set-up Round – (k1, p1) 6 (6) 6 (6) 7 (7) 7 (8) times, k1, pm, k 9 (9) 10 (10) 10 (9) 11 (10), pm, (k1, p1) 12 (12) 12 (12) 13 (13) 14 (14) times, k1, pm, k 9 (9) 10 (10) 10, (9) 11 (10) pm, (k1, p1) 6 (6) 6 (6) 7 (7) 7 (8) times.

1st Round – [k to marker, M1R, sm, k to marker, sm, M1L] twice, k to end – 4 sts increased.

2nd Round – (k1, p1) to marker, M1R, sm, k to marker, sm, M1L, (p1, k1) to 1st. before the marker, p1, M1R, sm, k to marker, sm, M1L, (p1, k1) to 1 st before the CB marker, p1 – 4 sts increased.

Repeat the last two rounds 5 (6) 7 (9) 9 (11) 11 (12) more times, and then 1st Round 1 more time. You now have 120 (128) 138 (154) 158 (174) 178 (190) sts on your needles.

Cut the yarn, remove CB marker, slip the sts. before the first marker to the right needle, rm. With color A yarn, BO 9 (9) 10 (10) 10 (9) 11 (10) sts for right shoulder, knit in pattern to next marker, rm, BO 9 (9) 10 (10) 10 (9) 11 (10) sts for left shoulder.

Back

From here, you will knit over 51 (55) 59 (67) 69 (78) 78 (85) back sts. back and forth.

1st Row (RS) – (k1, p1) to 2 sts to end, k2

2nd Row (WS) – purl to end

3rd Row (RS) – K1, (k1, p1) to 2 sts to end, k2

Repeat the last 2 rows 18 (18) 19 (19) 20 (20) 21 (22) more times.

Here you will CO 4 sts on both sides of your work to shape the armhole opening.

Next Row (WS) – Change to Color B – purl to end. CO 4 new sts at the end of the Row, using the Cable Cast On method.

Next Row (RS) – K1, (k1, p1) to 2 sts to end, k2. CO 4 new sts at the end of the Row, using the Cable Cast On method.

Now you have 63 (67) 71 (79) 85 (90) 90 (97) sts.

Repeat 2nd and 3rd Rows 16 (18) 19 (21) 23 (25) 27 (29) times.

Next Row (WS) – P1, (p1, k1) to 2 sts to end, p2

Next Row (RS) - K1, (k1, p1) to 2 sts to end, k2

Next Row (WS) – P1, (p1, k1) to 2 sts to end, p2

BO all sts. using Elizabeth Zimmerman Method or you preferred Elastic Bind Off Method.

Front

From here, you will knit over the 51 (55) 59 (67) 69 (78) 78 (85) front sts. back and forth.

With Color A yarn knit in Wrong Side Row

1st Row (WS) – purl to end

2nd Row (RS) – K1, (k1, p1) to 2 sts to end, k2

Repeat the last 2 rows 16 (16) 17 (17) 18 (18) 19 (20) more times.

You will CO 4 sts on both sides of your work to shape the armhole opening.

Next Row (WS) – Change to Color B – purl to end.

CO 4 new sts at the end of the Row, using Cable CO Method.

Next Row (RS) – K1, (k1, p1) to 2 sts to end, k2. CO 4 new sts at the end of the Row, using Cable CO method.

Now you have 59 (63) 67 (75) 77 (86) 86 (93) sts.

Repeat 1st and 2nd Rows 16 (18) 19 (21)
23 (25) 27 (29) times.

Next Row (WS) – P1, (p1, k1) to 2 sts to end, p2
Next Row (RS) - K1, (k1, p1) to 2 sts to end, k2
Next Row (WS) – P1, (p1, k1) to 2 sts to end, p2

BO all sts. using Elizabeth Zimmerman Method
or you preferred Elastic Bind Off method.

Finishing

Sew sides seams.
Weave in all ends.

Abbreviations

BO – Bind Off
CO - Cast On
CB – Center Back
K – knit
M1R – make one right -
M1L – make one left
P – purl

Pm – place marker
WS – wrong side
RS – right side
Rm – remove marker
Sm – slip marker
Stm – stitch marker
St/s – stitch/es

Techniques

M1L – increase – Make 1 Left – with your left hand needle, pick up the strand between the last stitch you knitted and the one you are about to knit, introducing the needle from the front to the back, then insert the tip of the right hand needle knitwise into the front leg of the strand and knit as usual.

M1R – increase – Make 1 Right -with your left hand needle, pick up the strand between the last stitch you knitted and the next st on the LH needle, bringing the needle from the back to the front, then insert the tip of the right hand needle purlwise into the back leg of the strand and knit as usual.





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
