## Delmira Hat

por Luciana López @lucianaloop.knits

*Delmira it is a bucket-type hat, with an adaptable structure and a light stockinette stitch texture, ideal for giving a fun twist to your first winter looks.*

*It is knitted in two parts, first the brim and then the body and crown, which arises from picking up stitches on the circumference of the brim, which gives it a very comfortable fit.*

## Size and Measurements

One size

Circumference: 63 cms / 25" at the brim

Circumference: 48 cms / 19" at the end brim

Length from brim to top: 20 cms/ 8"



## Yarn

Manos del Uruguay, Marla & Sami,  
100% merino superwash,  
273 yards / 250 mts per 100 grs.  
1 skein for the solid hat and 1 skein per color for  
the stripped version.



## Needles and Tools

- 2,5 mm / US #1 circular needles (at least 60 cms / 24")
- 2,5 mm / US #1 double pointed needles
- 1 tapestry needle.

## Gauge

35 sts and 22 rows = 10 cms / 4" in Stockinette  
Stitch pattern with 2,5 mm (1 US) needles.

Be sure to check your gauge. Adjust needle size if  
necessary to obtain the correct gauge.

## Abbreviations

**K:** Knit

**P:** Purl

**Sts:** Stitch

**K2tog:** Knit two stitches together.

**k2tog-tbl:** Knit two stitches together through  
back loop.

## Techniques

Cast On, knit and purl stitches, knitting in the round, rib, decreasing, pick up stitches.

## DIRECTIONS Solid Hat

### Brim

With a circular needle (2,5 mm / US #1) cast on 160 stitches and join for working in the round making sure not twist the sts. Place a marker at the beginning.

Rounds 1 to 3: Purl.

Rounds 4 to 6: Knit.

Round 7: (k2tog, k8) to end. - 144 sts.

Rounds 8 to 10: Knit

Round 11: (k2tog, k6) to end. - 126 sts.

Rounds 12 to 14: Knit

Round 15: (k2tog, k4) to end. - 105 sts.

Rounds 16 and 17: Knit

Bind off all the stitches **loosely**.

This is very important so that the bind off is not tight, for this it is suggested to close the stitches as follows: (k2tog-tbl, slip the stitch to the left needle) to the end.

Make sure that both points of the circular knitting, start and finish, are tidy and regular before picking up the stitches to knit the body of the hat.

## Body

Pick up 105 sts. behind the bind off stitches, not ahead, not above. In this way, the chain of bind off stitches will be visible. Each stitch we pick up must match with the column of stitches we had before the bind off. Be careful and do not mistakenly lift a "leg" of the bind off

Knit 15 more rows in stockinette stitch.

## Crown Shape

Round 1: (k2tog, k19) to end. - 100 sts.

Rounds 2 to 4: Knit.

Round 5: (k2tog, k18) to end. - 95 sts.

Rounds 6 to 8: Knit.

Round 9: (k2tog, k17) to end. - 90 sts.

Rounds 10 and 11: Knit.

Round 12: (k2tog, k16) to end. - 85 sts.

Rounds 13 and 14: Knit.

Round 15: (k2tog, k15) to end. - 80 sts.

Round 16: Knit.

Round 17: (k2tog, k14) to end. - 75 sts.

Round 18: Knit.

Round 19: (k2tog, k13) to end. - 70 sts.

Round 20: Knit.

Round 21: (k2tog, k12) to end. - 65 sts.

Round 22: Knit.

Round 23: (k2tog, k11) to end. - 60 sts.

Round 24: Knit.

Round 25: (k2tog, k10) to end. - 55 sts.

Round 26: Knit.

Round 27: (k2tog, k9) to end. - 50 sts.

Round 28: Knit.

Round 29: (k2tog, k8) to end. - 45 sts.

Round 30: Knit.

Round 31: (k2tog, k7) to end. - 40 sts.

Round 32: Knit.

Round 33: (k2tog, k6) to end. - 35 sts.

Round 34: Knit.

Round 35: (k2tog, k5) to end. - 30 sts.

Round 36: (k2tog, k4) to end. - 25 sts.

Round 37: (k2tog, k3) to end. - 20 sts.

Round 38: (k2tog) to end. - 10 sts.

## Finishing

Thread through remaining stitches, with the help of the tapestry needle, and pull tight, closing the gap.

Weave in loose ends. Wash and lay flat to finished measurements and shape.

## Striped Hat Version

To make the striped version we are going to follow the same instructions as for the solid version, but we are going **to change color every 4 rounds.**

Since we are knitting in the round we are going to have to do a little trick so that the stripes coincide at the beginning and end of the round, without jogless.
